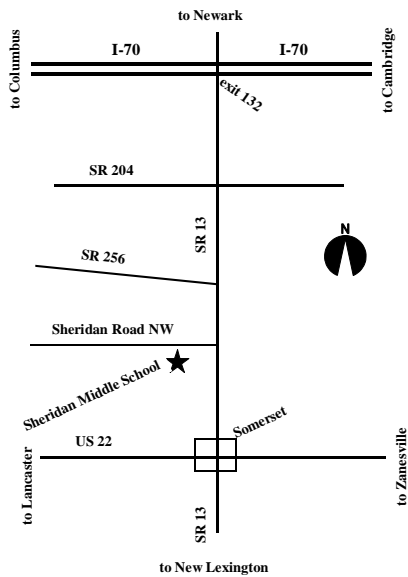

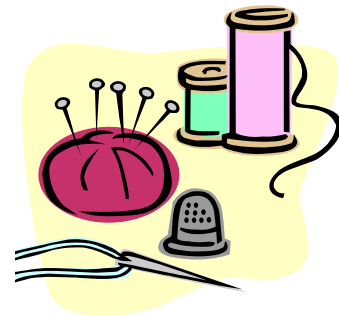

Classes & Descriptions

4-H Project Runway – OFFERED ONCE – 12:15 p.m. (Natalie Hull and State 4-H Fashion Board Members) Learn the 7 clues to the total look through group participation in designing an outfit from recyclable materials. Once designed, the models will take a trip down the runway; a must for 4-H'ers.

All About Fibers! – 1:15p.m. & 2:15 p.m. (Marti Dolata, Owner Spinning Turtle, Nelsonville) Knowing the characteristics of basic fibers that make up cloth, yarn or thread will improve your material selection whether you sew, knit, embroider, crochet, spin, felt or weave. Class will provide an overview of fiber characteristics, how to identify "mystery" fibers and what fiber is best or worst for your project. A booklet and fiber sampler with references will be available for \$5.00.

Alterations for the Larger Woman - DOUBLE SESSION (one time only) - 9:15 a.m. – 11:05 a.m. (Joyce Shriner, Extension Educator, Family & Consumer Sciences, Hocking County) Tired of wearing baggy clothes or ones that are so tight you can't move? Attend this session to learn how to alter patterns for larger women. Bring paper scissors and cellophane tape to practice the alterations during class.

Basic Needle Tatting - DOUBLE SESSION (one time only) - 9:15 a.m. - 11:05 a.m. April Hewlett (Owner, Grazeland Farm, Glenford) Learn basic techniques for beginner's Needle Tatting. Learn the art of making "poor man's lace". Bring a #5 tatting needle, #10 crochet thread and scissors OR a kit will be available for \$10.00. Class limit: 10.

Basic Purses – 1:15 p.m. & 2:15 p.m. (Vicki Bechtel, Master Clothing Educator, Knox County) Learn basic techniques for constructing purses including how to put in a zipper and magnetic closures.

Beyond the Basics in Needle Tatting – DOUBLE SESSION (one time only) - 12:15 p.m. – 2:05 p.m. (April Hewlett Owner, Grazeland Farm, Glenford) For those with basic needle tatting skills who want to learn more. Different and more advanced techniques will be demonstrated. Bring a #5 tatting needle, #10 crochet thread and scissors OR a kit will be available for \$10.00. Class limit 10.

Creative Toddler Book – 11:15 a.m. & 12:15 p.m. (Judy Foster, Sewing Professional, Knox County) Instructor will share helpful hints and techniques on how to construct a creative toddler activity book – great for small motor development skills.

Easy Gifts – 1:15 p.m. & 2:15 p.m. (Jane Schehl, Sewing Professional, Cambridge) Learn quick and easy gift ideas in sewing, cooking, and packaging.

Fabric Folding – 9:15 a.m. & 11:15 a.m. (Linda Root, Sewing Professional and Designer, West Manchester) Folding fabric is taking a piece of fabric (like you would with paper) and making it into embellishments to use in quilts, garments, wall hangings, purses, and anything else where your imagination can take you.

Fitting Figure Flaws – 10:15 a.m. & 11:15 a.m. (Daphne Hedgecock, Master Clothing Educator, Madison County, Owner, Daphne's Custom Creations) As you have gotten older, do your patterns fit differently? Learn to fit and alter patterns to accommodate the figure changes that occur as we age.

Fitting Finesse – 1:15 p.m. & 2:15 p.m. (Daphne Hedgecock, Master Clothing Educator, Madison County, Owner, Daphne's Custom Creations) Take the frustration out of fitting. Learn how to measure and what measurements to take. Use these measurements to alter your pattern before you cut.

Fun with Fleece – 10:15 a.m. & 12:15 p.m. (Lisa Maharg, Sewing Professional). Come and learn several ways to make things with fleece. Several items that are nice to keep or give as gifts will be demonstrated.

Go Cutter™ – Precise Cutting Product – 10:15 a.m. & 12:15 p.m. (Marla Knoch Work, Owner The Quilted Work, Stanleyville) Go Cutter – plus dies, by Accuquilt (better cuts make better quilts) Rotary Cuts (no more) fast-easy-safe Wow!

Interchangeable Purse – 9:15 a.m. & 12:15 p.m. (Rachelle Yost, Owner Sew Happy Quilting, Little Hocking) Learn how to make a wonderfully simple interchangeable purse. Handles can be removed and put on a different bag. Kit will cost \$23.00 plus \$8.00 for the pattern.

Invest in Vests – 11:15 a.m. & 2:15 p.m. (Sunny Hickey, Sewing Professional, Miamisburg) A look at VESTS as wardrobe investment pieces for all seasons. Pattern and fabric selections plus construction techniques and trims will be discussed. Examples will be displayed.

Jackets, Jackets, Jackets – 11:15 a.m. & 2:15 p.m. (Wanda Unger, Owner, Sew Perfect, West Lafayette) Learn how to make many different styles of jackets from sweatshirts including quilted, jackets with collar and cuffs, appliquéd, and embellished.

Know Your Serger – 10:15 a.m. & 11:15 a.m. (Vicki Bechtel, Master Clothing Educator, Knox County) How well do you know your serger? Learn tips and techniques including how to thread a 2-3-4 thread serger and decorative stitches.

Know Your Sewing Machine - 9:15 a.m. & 1:15 p.m. (Carole Lewis, Owner, Sew-Right Machine & Repair, Zanesville) Learn the correct terminology for your sewing machine. Learn tips on maintenance, needles, etc. A technician will be on hand to answer questions.

Make Do! Recycle with your Sewing Machine – 11:15 a.m. & 1:15 p.m. (Carolyn Mann, Owner, Sew Far Out, Brinkhaven) In this class you will learn to make several projects that recycle and reuse common household stuff using your sewing machine. Recover a pillow, make a grocery tote bag with pet food bags, make a slip cover, make a quilt with recycled fabrics, and a variety of other ideas. A helpful handout will be available and lots of samples will be shown including some vintage things from Mom and Grandma who were good at this!

Make it and Take it Crayon Creations – 9:15 a.m. & 1:15 p.m. (Debbie Pipes, Master Clothing Educator, Perry County and Diana Gatenbee, Sewing Professional, Columbus) Everyone needs a project for a cold, icy winter day – or a hot, humid summer day! Any day could be a good day for this project. Any age level and any skill level will enjoy creating with crayons. You can create a quilt that will have you feeling like a kid again. With a few crayons and a little imagination you can work wonders.

Make-it and Take-it Mug Rug – 10:15 a.m. & 1:15 p.m. (Nancy Fischer, Artisan, Licking County) Nestle your morning coffee or a hot cup of tea on a “mug rug”. Learn traditional felt making techniques; be inspired to select your own colors, accents, and embellishments.

Market Tote – 9:15 a.m. & 1:15 p.m. (Susan Holmes, Owner, Nelsonville Quilt Company) Using pre-cut vinyl mesh and 2 fat quarters – create a personalized bag to carry anything. A perfect tote for those who want to “go green”.

Noodle Doodles, an Original Quilt Design – 10:15 a.m. & 2:15 p.m. (Carolyn Mann, Owner, Sew Far Out, Brinkhaven) Class participants will receive a pattern for an original quilt. This quilt starts with Double Wedding Ring arcs and uses them in all new ways! This design uses the QuiltSmart method to make the arcs so it is easy to make but will appeal to experienced quilters as well as those just starting out.

Prairie Points – 11:15 a.m. & 2:15 p.m. (Beverly Neff, Owner, Neff’s Country Loft, Belpre) Learn how to make and apply Prairie Points to your quilts or quilt projects.

Pricing Your Product – OFFERED ONCE -12:15 p.m. (Cindy Shuster, Extension Educator, Family & Consumer Sciences, Perry County) Pricing is one of the most difficult problems for the sewing professional. Learn techniques for pricing your products.

Put Your Best Foot Forward – 10:15 a.m. & 12:15 p.m. (Caroline Frye, Master Clothing Educator, Champaign County) Using sewing machine feet can make your sewing challenge much easier. Presenter will demonstrate how the feet are used and share some items to illustrate the ends results.

Quick Trip and Disappearing 9 Patch Quilts – 10:15 a.m. & 11:15 a.m. (Judy Loraditch, Sewing Professional, Cumberland) Both these quilts are easy enough for beginning quilt projects. If you’ve thought you might like to make a quilt, this class will be a good place to start.

Recycling Garments – 1:15 p.m. & 2:15 p.m. (Linda Root, Sewing Professional and Designer, West Manchester) This is a way to make the clothes you wear very affordable, one of a kind. Come, bring a piece of clothing, tablecloth that just needs help, a picture of something that you want to keep, but just not in the same state it is in now.

Rug Hooking – OFFERED ONCE – 9:15 a.m. (Susan Nash, Co-Owner, Somerset Wool, Somerset). Learn the basics of rug hooking with wool strips (traditional rug hooking); equipment and materials needed; the techniques of hooking and the different types of rugs and mats.

Sewing for Nature Lovers – 9:15 a.m. & 12:15 p.m. (Ann McDowell, Sewing Enthusiast, Franklin County) This 4-H trained sewer enjoys using “green” techniques in her projects. Utilize fabric scraps even ¼” pieces. See how this instructor shares her love of animals in some of her creations while using small fabric scraps.

Sewing for Profit – OFFERED ONCE - 10:15 a.m. (Cindy Shuster, Extension Educator, Family & Consumer Sciences, Perry County) Do you have the qualities to be successful while enjoying a custom sewing business in the home? Learn practical information on starting your own sewing business.

Snuggler – Pillow Blanket – 10:15 a.m. & 12:15 p.m. (Jane Toki, Owner, Me and Mom’s Custom Creations, Corning) Take two yards of Polar Fleece, a zipper and some hook and loop tape to keep baby warm and comfortable in their car seat or stroller. Then it folds up into a pillow to take to grandma’s or to day care.

Spool Knitting Universe – 9:15 a.m. & 2:15 p.m. (Joanna Ettore, Artisan, Licking County) From coil baskets and placemats with fabric strips to bead/fiber jewelry, this class will introduce the range of things you can knit without needles, from a four prong to a 120 prong tool. The simple skill of making stitches is perfect for folks from 4 to 100 years of age.

T-Shirt = Shirt Transformation. Time for an Update? – 9:15 a.m. & 11:15 a.m. (Kathryn Coursen, Master Clothing Educator, Hocking County) Five interesting, easy and useful ways to change the look, purpose and personality of a t-shirt or sweater.

Working with Wool – 11:15 a.m. & 2:15 p.m. (Mary Smith, Sewing Professional, Beaver Creek) Wool is one of the most versatile fibers. What do you need to know when working with wool? The workshop will cover selection of fabric, fabric sources, fabric preparation, sewing and pressing tips. Now is the time to add a woolen garment to your spring wardrobe.
