### GENERAL GUIDELINES

1. Age of Participants:
  - 4-H Age unless noted in specific class guidelines
2. Participation Guidelines:
  - Winner of any one class in 2011 is not eligible to participate in the same class for 2012.
  - Each county may have no more than one participant in each class. No exhibitor shall be entered in more than one class.
  - Each person registered for this event must be a 4-H member in 2012 and have completed the specific project in which he/she is participating to be eligible for a Clock Trophy.
  - Unfortunately, time does not allow for explanation of answers after each event. Participants need to review their project book on their own after the event to verify their answers.
  - State fair worksheets will not be returned to participants.
  - Participants may bring additional visual displays, but they are not required. Participants with no display or visual will NOT be at a disadvantage during the judging event.
3. Type of Evaluation:
  - Judging consists of: completing a worksheet activity station, completing a hands-on activity station and an interview with a judge (see specific examples as listed in class list below)
4. Participant to bring:
  - Registration information provided by County 4-H Educator.
  - Completed project book.
  - Sharpened pencil

### Classes:

#### J-1 and J-2 (ages 10-13)

an interview with a judge relating to the project book and share with the judge a *completed Money Journal*.

#### J-3 and J-4 (ages 14-19)

The interview with a judge will include a sharing of one completed project book activity (examples: *completed file system, 4 week spending log, comparison of bank services and costs, evaluation of comparison shopping experience, analysis of career possibility in finance, etc.*);

#### J-5 (ages 12-13) and J-6 (ages 14-15)

The interview with a judge will include a sharing of one completed project book activity (examples: *comparison of financial institutions, shopping comparison, use of credit analysis, money management record, advertisement collage, decision making, goal setting, etc.*)
