GENERAL GUIDELINES

1. Age of Participants
 - 4-H Age
2. Participation Guidelines
 - The clock trophy winner of any class in 2011 is not eligible to participate in the same class for 2012.
 - Individuals may participate in both one morning class and one afternoon class.
 - Counties may select one individual to participate in each class, Class J-1 through J-21.
 - Participants must be enrolled in and have completed the project in which they compete as listed in the 2012 Family Guide to 4-H. Note: Switching members from one project to another after they have completed their project or during county judging is unethical and strictly prohibited.
 - 4-H'ers who take more than one clothing project must complete separate learning experiences related to each, including creating a separate, complete, total-look outfit FOR EACH PROJECT. (e.g. a top made for one project cannot be used in another project).
 - All participants will take part in the judging and fashion revue indicated for their class.

Specific Guidelines for the awards on the following page, #4, Roby; #5, Ohio 4-H Fashion Revue; and #6, Master Clothing Educators.

- a. **Counties may nominate only one individual per award.**
- b. **Nominees cannot be considered for multiple awards.**
- c. **Award winners cannot win any award more than once in their 4-H career.**

3. Type of Evaluation
 - Participants will take part in circle judging and have an interview with a judge. Judges will evaluate participants based on the score sheet criteria for the project (also see sample score sheet).
4. **Registration will take place in the judging circle for the project category.** Participants should be dressed in the outfit they made or assembled according to the guidelines and information in their project book. Dressing rooms will be available from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Exceptions: (1) for individuals enrolled in Sew for Others, the "other" may wear the garment, and (2) for individuals enrolled in Shopping Savvy, the outfit worn on stage should be neat and presentable but does not have to fulfill an interest area activity.
5. Participant should bring the following with them to registration.
 - Registration material provided by County 4-H Youth Development Educator.
 - Completed narration card.
 - Completed project book and records to help explain project accomplishments to the judge.

AWARDS AND SPONSORS

1. Each participant will receive a participation ribbon, sponsored by the Ohio State Fair. Daily "Outstanding of the Day" ribbons, sponsored by The Ohio State Fair, will be given to the top 20% of the class. One overall clock trophy will be presented to the winner in each class at the end of the week of Fashion Revue.
2. In 2011 clock trophies were sponsored by: **Fashion Group of Columbus, Ohio 4-H Foundation** through funds provided by Norma Pitts, Extension Clothing Specialist, Emeriti and the **Ohio Township Association**.
3. Participants who do an outstanding job in using pork products in their garments will be eligible to receive an award from the **Ohio Pork Schop**. Participants who do an outstanding job in using wool in their garments will be eligible to receive an award from the **Ohio Sheep & Wool Program, the Ohio Sheep Improvement Association and Ohio Make It Yourself with Wool**. Participants who do an outstanding job in using mohair in their garments will be eligible to receive a Mohair Award from **Callan Cattle Company, Newark Ohio**. The judges will make the final selections.
4. **LLOYD AND DORIS ROBY 4-H CLOTHING PROGRAM AWARD** (\$500 cash award to be applied to college tuition or other career development opportunities.) Each county may nominate one individual for the Lloyd and Doris Roby 4-H Clothing Program Award. Nominees must be at least a junior in High School as of January 1, 2012. Nominee needs to bring a completed Ohio 4-H Clothing Achievement Record with a photo of the participant in their 2012 4-H Total Look outfit and present it when they register for their class at the State Fair Clothing judging. Selection is based on overall outstanding achievement in 4-H clothing and evidence of leadership skills throughout their involvement in the 4-H program. During the week of 4-H Fashion Revue, a finalist will be selected daily and the winner will be announced immediately following the Thursday afternoon Fashion Revue.
5. **OHIO 4-H FASHION REVUE AWARD** – (Award and sponsor to be announced). Each county may nominate one participant to apply for this award. Applicants must be enrolled in one of the clothing construction projects (J-1, J-2, J-6, J-8, J-9, J-11 through J-20). Nominees need to bring a completed Ohio 4-H Clothing Achievement Record, along with a photo of the participant in their 2012 Total Look outfit and present it when they register for their class at the State Fair Clothing judging. **All nominees that are chosen as State Fair Outstanding of the Day winners will be considered in the selection of this award.** Selection is based on how well the nominee achieves the total look, overall outstanding achievement in 4-H clothing. During the week of 4-H Fashion Revue, a finalist will be selected daily and the winner will be announced immediately following the Thursday afternoon Fashion Revue.
6. **MASTER CLOTHING EDUCATORS OF OHIO AWARD (Pending availability of funding for 2012)** – Junior and Senior Categories. A cash award (amount to announced each year) to be applied to college tuition or other career development opportunities. Each county may nominate one individual in the Senior category (ages 16 & up) as of January 1, 2012, and one individual in the Junior category (ages 12-15) as of January 1, 2012 for the award. Nominees need to bring a completed Ohio 4-H Clothing Achievement Record along with a photo of them in their 2012 4-H Total Look Outfit and present it when they register for their class at the Ohio State Fair 4-H Clothing judging. **All nominees that are chosen as State Fair Outstanding of the Day winners will be considered in the selection of this award.** Selection is based on overall outstanding achievement in 4-H clothing and evidence of leadership skills throughout their involvement in the 4-H program. During the week of State 4-H Fashion Revue, a finalist will be selected in each category daily and the winner selected from these finalists will be announced immediately following the Thursday afternoon Fashion Revue.

Any county board that would like to participate should prepare a tabletop exhibit related to the clothing program or to the board's accomplishments and activities.

Eight (8) foot tables will be available along the south side of the Rhodes Center Auditorium for county boards to use for their displays. The displays may be left for one to all three days of the Fashion Revue. Each county board will be responsible for setting up, maintaining, and tearing down their own exhibit. To obtain a space for your county fashion board display, contact Cindy Shuster, Assistant Superintendent by July 15, 2012.

We are looking forward to the many County 4-H Fashion Board exhibits at the 2012 State 4-H Fashion Revue! This will be a terrific opportunity to share some of the outstanding accomplishments and opportunities available through the 4-H clothing program.

As an Ohio State Fair 4-H Fashion Revue participant, you need to bring your registration information, completed narration card, completed project book, and Ohio 4-H Clothing Achievement Record, if you are your county's nominee. These materials will be collected when you **register in the judging circle.**

You have been selected for the class in which you've enrolled and completed your project as checked below. Please register at the time indicated for your class on the date indicated for your county in the Rhodes Center Auditorium just south of the 17th Avenue Gate on the Ohio State Fairgrounds. **Registration will take place in the judging circles.**

Please be in the Rhodes Center Auditorium by 8:30 a.m. on the date indicated for your county on the registration card. Dressing rooms will be available for participants from 8:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. (Dressing rooms will be locked at 6:00 p.m.) Participants should be dressed in their 4-H garment and in the judging circle by 8:30 a.m. (Exception: for individuals enrolled in Sew for Others, the "other" should be wearing the garment). You will be involved with your class from 8:30 a.m. until the end of the Fashion Revue at approximately 12:30 p.m. There will be a short break before the morning Fashion Revue begins.

If you are a participant in one of the eleven morning classes, you will be evaluated on your knowledge, skill, and understanding related to your project. Please bring your completed project book and any other records you have to show your project accomplishments to discuss in an interview with a professional judge when you register at 8:30 a.m. **You will register with your judge in the judging circle.** In addition, you should also bring the following, as appropriate for your class.

J-1 SEW FOR OTHERS: It is desirable, but not required, for the "other" to be present to show an outfit you made at the 8:30 a.m. judging and 11:00 a.m. Fashion Revue. If your "other" cannot be present, simply bring the garments you made to show the judge and to exhibit at the Fashion Revue. **We limit the number of "others" and outfits to no more than one "other" outfit per entrant. If you made outfits for more than one "other" or multiple outfits for a single other, choose one outfit that best represents your work to bring to the State Fair.** (Note: The reason for this limitation is that 4-Hers who brought more than one "other" or multiple outfits in the past years were hindered by "babysitting" and "juggling" chores, and were at a disadvantage in trying to communicate their accomplishments to the judges.) If the project is repeated for multiple years, a new category of "other" must be selected.

J-2 FUN WITH CLOTHES: Please wear the complete outfit you assembled, including your decorated t-shirt or sweatshirt.

J-3, J-4, and J-5 SHOPPING SAVVY: Beginner, Intermediate, Advanced: You will want to be dressed in a total look outfit assembled according to the information in your project to convey the image you wish to project to the audience and judges. However, the youth will be judged on mastery of project book rather than outfits worn unless the outfit was put together to complete an activity within the project.

J-6 CREATIVE COSTUMES: Please wear the costume you made for yourself. The youth will be judged on the mastery of project book in addition to the garment constructed.

J-7 ACCESSORIES FOR TEENS: Please wear at least one accessory you made with the outfit for which it was designed.

J-8 CLOTHING FOR YOUR CAREER: Please wear the outfit you made. The outfit should have a minimum of two pieces.

J-9 SEW FUN: You will make one item of clothing using an “easy” or “beginner” pattern (top, skirt, shorts, pants, or capris).

J-10 FRUGAL FASHION: Please wear a put-together “total look” outfit. This total look outfit should be put together as inexpensively as possible. Two accessory items and one minor garment in the outfit can, but does not have to be from existing wardrobe items. Shoes in the existing wardrobe will not count as one of the two accessory items, but will be considered in the total look evaluation. You are allowed to make minor alterations to purchased clothes, such as shortening the hem, or changing to update the look.

J-21 embellish: Complete all ten activities (including a sample notebook as described in Activity 6) and three Talking It Over pages, and add embellishment (s) to at least one garment for your total look outfit.

A daily finalist will be announced each day after the afternoon Fashion Revue. The overall winner will be announced immediately following the Thursday afternoon Fashion Revue.

_____ You have been selected to compete for the overall winner of the **MASTER CLOTHING EDUCATORS OF OHIO AWARD (pending availability of funding for 2012)**, Senior Category (age 16-18 as of January 1, 2012). You need to complete an Ohio 4-H Clothing Achievement Record including a photo of yourself in your 2012 4-H outfit and present it when you register for your class. The judges will review your application and consider you to receive a cash award (amount to be announced) to apply towards college tuition or other career development opportunities. A daily finalist will be announced each day after the afternoon Fashion Revue. The overall winner will be announced immediately following the Thursday afternoon Fashion Revue.

Participation and Outstanding of the Day awards will be presented at each Fashion Revue. As soon as your Fashion Revue is over, you will need to remove your things from the dressing room. Dressing rooms will be locked at 6:00 p.m. daily. The 4-H Assistants will take leftover items to the Fashion Board Dressing Room where they will remain until 5:30 p.m. Thursday, August 2. They will then be taken to the State 4-H Office where they must be picked up before September 1, 2012. Any unclaimed items will be donated to charity.

To be eligible for all state opportunities listed on the cover sheet of this form, members need to complete this "Ohio 4-H Clothing Achievement Record" and meet all of the criteria listed below. The "Ohio 4-H Clothing Achievement Record" is comprehensive in nature and may take some time to complete. Work on it should be started as soon as possible. The completed form is submitted the day your county is competing at the Ohio State Fair Fashion Revue.

STATE FAIR GUIDELINES FOR COMPLETING THE OHIO 4-H ACHIEVEMENT RECORD FOR STATE FAIR 4-H CLOTHING AWARDS

1. Limited type/print to no more than 15 characters per inch (including 4-H personal story).
2. No additional pages may be added to any section (A through G) of the "Ohio 4-H Clothing Achievement Record".
3. Your "Ohio 4-H Clothing Achievement Record" should include the adapted cover page and be stapled in the upper left hand corner. Do not use folders or additional cover pages.
4. Each award may only be received once by a 4-H member in their 4-H career.

REQUIREMENT CHECKLIST FOR STATE FAIR 4-H CLOTHING AWARDS

When applying for **STATE FAIR 4-H CLOTHING AWARDS**, please submit the following items:

- Your completed "Ohio 4-H Clothing Achievement Record" (each page single sided).

- a winter meeting will be held to recognize retiring members (2011) and evaluate the 2011 Ohio State 4-H Fashion Revue, and to finalize plans for 2012 educational program offerings including, but not limited to the Ohio 4-H Teen Conference, the Ohio 4-H Volunteer Conference, the Sewing Smorgasbord and related regional and/or county workshops;
- participation in the Ohio 4-H Teen Conference and the Ohio 4-H Volunteer Conference;
- a summer meeting will be held to identify a theme, make plans and divide assignments for the Ohio State Fair 4-H Fashion Revue; and
- the four days at the Ohio State Fair to carry out their assignments associated with the State 4-H Fashion Revue.
