Ohio 4-H Delegation to Japan. (2013)
For Ohio 4-H'ers ages 12-18 years old (still age 18 on travel date)

DATE/DEADLINE:

Applications for the next delegation, which will travel July 6 – August 4, 2013, will be due in the State 4-H Office by January 24, 2013, with a deposit.

Attendance at selection interviews in Columbus on January 28 or February 3-4, 2013, is required by all applicants and at least one parent. In addition, a required orientation will be held in Columbus in May or June 2013 for each participant and at least one parent.

Japan; statewide

SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships of at least \$1000 will be offered to all selected participants. Scholarships are based on selection interviews and hosting history. More information will be available in November 2012.

GOALS/OBJECTIVES:

To provide Ohio 4-H youth with an opportunity to...

- * learn a new way of life by living it during a 4-week homestay program.
- * become part of a Japanese family and learn more about themselves and Japan in the process.
- * face the challenge of representing 4-H, Ohio and the United States.
- * share their experiences with Ohioans upon their return.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION:

Every other year, Ohio youth join about 50 youth from around the country in the 4-H/Labo Exchange Program to Japan. The State 4-H Office provides all support for the program, including orientation, travel arrangements, etc. The youth are welcomed into the home of a Japanese host family, where they learn about the Japanese culture on an everyday basis. Upon their return, they are encouraged to share their experiences with other Ohioans. 4-H'ers who have already hosted a Labo Delegate in Ohio may request to be placed with the Japanese family of the delegate. Most Japanese families are able to host in such circumstances.
