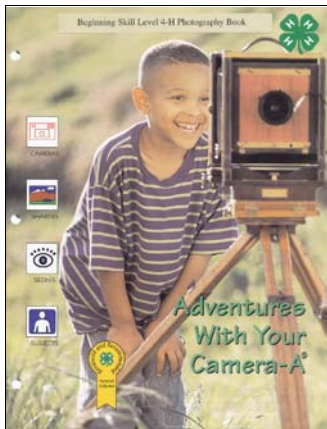




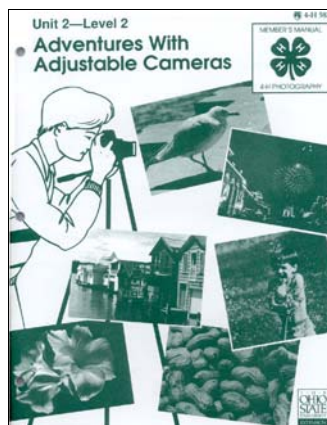
4-H COMMUNICATION PROJECTS LIST



Adventures With Your Camera - A (579) . Look at the world through your own special viewer by discovering camera magic and how it works. Learn how to: properly hold a camera, identify the parts of a camera, properly care for your camera, identify the right film for the circumstances, choose good subjects, share your photos digitally, tell a story using pictures, take trick pictures, and much more. (Recommended as a beginning level project for youth ages 8 - 10 and older. This project may be repeated once.)

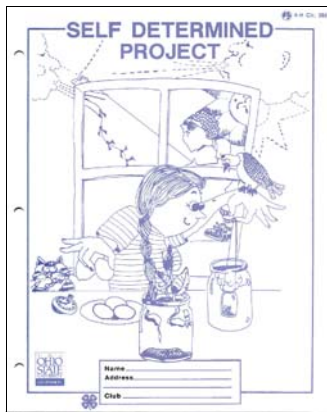


Adventures With Your Camera - B (580). Take successful shots using photography basics and learning advanced techniques in composition and film processing. Learn how to: utilize lighting techniques, improve picture composition, improve photos through cropping, share your photos digitally, and much more. (Recommended as an intermediate level project for youth ages 11- 14 and older. This project may be repeated.)(Project # 579 - “Adventures With Your Camera - A” should be taken prior to doing this project.)



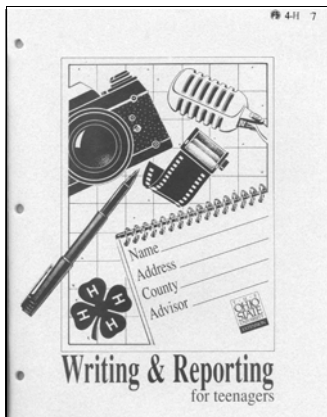
Adventures with Adjustable Cameras (583). Refine your photography skills by selecting various options on your camera for each picture. Learn how to: control film exposure, adjust shutter speeds, control sharpness, take double exposures, use different types of lenses, and much more. (Recommended as an intermediate level project for youth ages 11- 14 and older who have access to an adjustable camera. This project may be repeated.)(Project # 579 - “Adventures With Your Camera - A” should be taken prior to doing this project.)

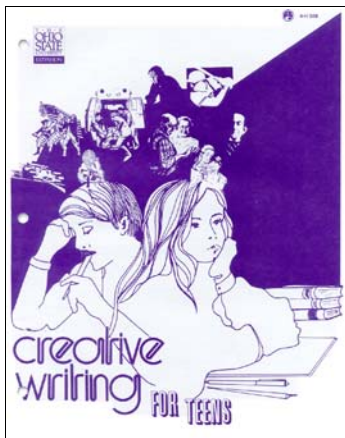
Advanced Photography - Self-Determined (365).

Create and complete your own special project in the area of photography. Select your own area of interest and do your own research, activities and documentation as part of a self-determined photography project. Practice different activities related to your area of interest, then write a short report on what you learned. (Recommended as an advanced level project for youth ages 14-19).



Writing and Reporting for Teens (587).

Write, report and photograph your way to a byline or news anchor position by developing journalistic fundamentals that practice makes perfect. Learn how to: be a news writer, make a scrap book, identify news, write a news story, take a news photo, get your news story and/or picture published, explore a career in journalism and much more. (Recommended as an advanced level project for youth ages 14 - 19).



Creative Writing (588).

Take the first step as a writer or poet by exercising your creativity with a project designed to stimulate your imagination. Learn how to: develop an idea file, practice writing about different topics, understand what the term “fiction story” means, practice writing your own fiction story, the different types of poetry, write your own poem, and much more (Recommended as an intermediate level project for youth ages 11- 13 and older).
