Drill Team Score Sheet Explanation

OBEDIENCE EXERCISES: Obedience will be judged using the same criteria as individual obedience classes.

HEELING - The team can do any form of heeling patterns. Heeling patterns must include at least **three (3) sits, one (1) fast and one (1) slow** movement.

FIGURE 8 - The Figure 8 can be done in any type of formation. There must be **two (2) sits** during the Figure 8 pattern.

STAND FOR EXAMINATION - The Stand for Examination can be done in any type of formation. It must be done **once (1 time)** during the presentation.

RECALL - The Recall can be done in any type of formation. There must be at least **one (1) Recall** per dog and handler team during the performance.

DOWN - Each dog must complete **one (1) 1-minute Down** during the performance. The Down may be on or off leash. The Down can be done in any formation. Dogs must stay in the down position. Handlers can have movement during the Down. Examples include handler dancing, marching, and moving around or away from the dog while it is in the down position.

REQUIRED ELEMENTS:

MOVING CIRCLES - Every dog and handler team must participate in at least **two (2) moving circles**.

MOVING STRAIGHT LINES - Each dog and handler team must participate in at least **two (2) moving straight lines**.

TEAM PARTICIPATION - All dog and handler teams must participate in the entire routine.

PRESENTATION:

OVERALL PRESENTATION/ENTERTAINMENT VALUE - This is a score that will be given for the overall entertainment value or crowd appeal of the presentation. Judges will consider these questions during scoring: Was it entertaining? Did the presentation keep the viewers' attention throughout the *whole* routine? Were handlers and dogs enjoying themselves? Did the routine flow well? Was the flow smooth from one exercise/element to the next?

ROUTINE COMPLEXITY AND ELEMENT EXECUTION - This score will take into consideration degree of difficulty and how precise the elements were executed within the routine. Elements with a higher degree of difficulty that were well executed will be given higher point consideration. Routines do not have to be difficult to score highly! An easy movement done well will be given higher points consideration than a difficult element done poorly.

CREATIVITY - Judges will be granting points based on creativity and originality of individual elements within the performance. They will also look at how the costumes contribute to the overall theme. When considering the costumes, judges will look at creative use of materials and NOT the amount of money spent to produce a costume. Props are permitted only as wearable parts of the exhibitor's clothing.

MUSIC APPROPRIATENESS TO ROUTINE - The judge will consider the tempo and genera of music to see if the routine fits the music selection. Judges will look to see if pace of the routine matches tempo of the music.

ATTITUDE/ENTHUSIASM - Points will be awarded for positive attitudes and enthusiasm. Remember, *all team members contribute to this score*.

USE OF SPACE - Teams will be awarded points for effectively using the entire show arena. The ring size will be 50 feet x 50 feet. Teams need to stay inside this diameter.

PENALTIES:

ANIMAL RESPECT - Judges will watch to see that the dog is a respected partner of the team. They may ask themselves these questions: Is the dog a willing participant? Has the dog been "drug" throughout the routine? Is the handler treating the dog like a prop or like a teammate? Is the handler aware that there is a dog on the leash? Is the dog given inappropriate corrections? Are the elements in the routine appropriate for the dog's condition and age? If the handler shows lack of respect for his/her teammate, they will incur a **substantial** point deduction per occurrence.

DISCIPLINING - The show ring is not the proper place to discipline your dog. The amount of points deducted will depend on the severity of the discipline. Inappropriate discipline will incur point deductions.

FOULING THE RING - There will be a **25-point** deduction for each instance of a dog fouling in the ring.

BARKING - Points will be deducted for barking unless it is an obvious part of the routine.

DOG LEAVES THE RING - There will be a **10-point** deduction for each instance of a dog leaving the ring.

UNUSUAL BEHAVIOR - Points will be deducted for and not limited to the following: dog aggression, dog displaying dominance, dog visiting spectators, etc.

INAPPROPRIATE MUSIC - Points will be deducted for music that is offensive or has inappropriate language.

RULES VIOLATIONS - Deductions will be taken for violating rules found in the Ohio State Fair 4-H Handbook and *Rules for 2007 Ohio State Fair Junior Fair Dog Show Participation*.

TIME VIOLATIONS - Five (5) points will be deducted for presentations less than 5 minutes and more than 7 minutes.

Drill Team Score Sheet Explanation

OBEDIENCE EXERCISES: Obedience will be judged using the same criteria as individual obedience classes.

HEELING - The team can do any form of heeling patterns. Heeling patterns must include at least **three (3) sits, one (1) fast and one (1) slow movement.**

FIGURE 8 - The Figure 8 can be done in any type of formation. There must be **two (2) sits** during the Figure 8 pattern.

STAND FOR EXAMINATION - The Stand for Examination can be done in any type of formation. It must be done **once (1 time)** during the presentation.

RECALL - The Recall can be done in any type of formation. There must be at least **one (1) Recall** per dog and handler team during the performance.

DOWN - Each dog must complete **one (1) 1-minute Down** during the performance. The Down may be on or off leash. The Down can be done in any formation. Dogs must stay in the down position. Handlers can have movement during the Down. Examples include handler dancing, marching, and moving around or away from the dog while it is in the down position.

REQUIRED ELEMENTS:

MOVING CIRCLES - Every dog and handler team must participate in at least **two (2) moving circles.**

MOVING STRAIGHT LINES - Each dog and handler team must participate in at least **two (2) moving straight lines.**

TEAM PARTICIPATION - All dog and handler teams must participate in the entire routine.

PRESENTATION:

OVERALL PRESENTATION/ENTERTAINMENT VALUE - This is a score that will be given for the overall entertainment value or crowd appeal of the presentation. Judges will consider these questions during scoring: Was it entertaining? Did the presentation keep the viewers' attention throughout the *whole* routine? Were handlers and dogs enjoying themselves? Did the routine flow well? Was the flow smooth from one exercise/element to the next?

ROUTINE COMPLEXITY AND ELEMENT EXECUTION - This score will take into consideration degree of difficulty and how precise the elements were executed within the routine. Elements with a higher degree of difficulty that were well executed will be given higher point consideration. Routines do not have to be difficult to score highly! An easy movement done well will be given higher points consideration than a difficult element done poorly.

CREATIVITY - Judges will be granting points based on creativity and originality of individual elements within the performance. They will also look at how the costumes contribute to the overall theme. When considering the costumes, judges will look at creative use of materials and NOT the amount of money spent to produce a costume. Props are permitted only as wearable parts of the exhibitor's clothing.

MUSIC APPROPRIATENESS TO ROUTINE - The judge will consider the tempo and genera of music to see if the routine fits the music selection. Judges will look to see if pace of the routine matches tempo of the music.

ATTITUDE/ENTHUSIASM - Points will be awarded for positive attitudes and enthusiasm. Remember, *all team members contribute to this score.*

USE OF SPACE - Teams will be awarded points for effectively using the entire show arena. The ring size will be 50 feet x 50 feet. Teams need to stay inside this diameter.

PENALTIES:

ANIMAL RESPECT - Judges will watch to see that the dog is a respected partner of the team. They may ask themselves these questions: Is the dog a willing participant? Has the dog been "drug" throughout the routine? Is the handler treating the dog like a prop or like a teammate? Is the handler aware that there is a dog on the leash? Is the dog given inappropriate corrections? Are the elements in the routine appropriate for the dog's condition and age? If the handler shows lack of respect for his/her teammate, they will incur a **substantial** point deduction per occurrence.

DISCIPLINING - The show ring is not the proper place to discipline your dog. The amount of points deducted will depend on the severity of the discipline. Inappropriate discipline will incur point deductions.

FOULING THE RING - There will be a **25-point** deduction for each instance of a dog fouling in the ring.

BARKING - Points will be deducted for barking unless it is an obvious part of the routine.

DOG LEAVES THE RING - There will be a **10-point** deduction for each instance of a dog leaving the ring.

UNUSUAL BEHAVIOR - Points will be deducted for and not limited to the following: dog aggression, dog displaying dominance, dog visiting spectators, etc.

INAPPROPRIATE MUSIC - Points will be deducted for music that is offensive or has inappropriate language.

RULES VIOLATIONS - Deductions will be taken for violating rules found in the Ohio State Fair 4-H Handbook and *Rules for 2007 Ohio State Fair Junior Fair Dog Show Participation.*

TIME VIOLATIONS - Five (5) points will be deducted for presentations less than 5 minutes and more than 7 minutes.
